Local Notice of Filing

On February 3, Bunyard Broadcasting, licensee of KILX, an FM station on 105.3 MHz, at De Queen, Arkansas, filed an application with the Federal Communications Commission to operate KILX on 105.5 MHz, at Lockesburg, Arkansas. Instructions for Posting

An applicant for an FCC authorization that requires local notice of filing must post the notice on a publicly-accessible website. For an existing station, it is likely to be the station's own website. For new applications for new stations, the applicant must post the notice on some other "publicly-accessible website," which is defined as an internet website (a) that is accessible to members of the public without registration or payment requirements, or any other requirement that the user provide information or respond to a survey or questionnaire in exchange for being able to access information on the website, and (b) that is locally targeted to the area served by the station. As examples, the Commission suggests a local government website, local community bulletin board website, or state broadcasters' association website.

The Commission has said that to the extent a station lacking an affiliated website is able to document its inability to publish its information on a locally targeted, publicly available website, it may submit a waiver request to use an alternative means of providing local public notice.

The notice must be posted within five days after the FCC gives public notice of the acceptance for filing of the application, and must remain posted for 30 days.

On Air Announcements Requirements:

- Who must make announcements: Operating AM, FM, and LPFM stations seeking to change their city of license must make these announcements.
- When to make announcements: The announcements must begin within five business days after the FCC releases a public notice that the station's city of license change application has been accepted for filing.
- How many announcements: A total of six announcements must be made within the four weeks following the application's acceptance for filing.
- Announcement frequency: No more than two announcements per week and no more than one announcement per day should be made.
- Announcement timing: Announcements should be made between 7 AM and 11 PM local time, Monday through Friday.
- Content of the announcement: The announcement should inform the public of the proposed city of license change and provide them with an opportunity to file comments with the FCC.
